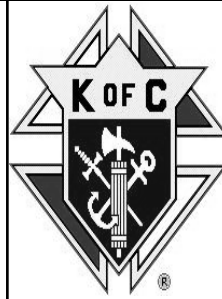

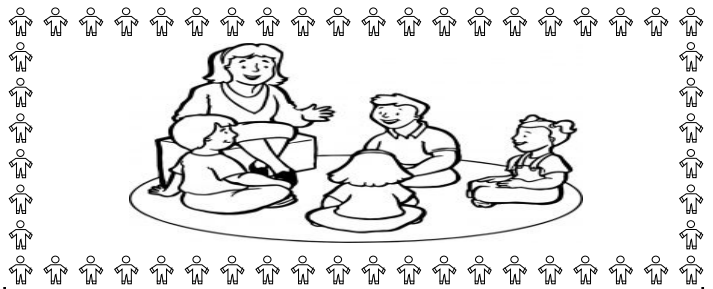

Strive to manifest trauma-informed sensitivity
What are some practical ways we can interact with others that are trauma-informed? We can be mindful of what we talk about and how, recognizing that certain topics can trigger a trauma memory. We can also take those topics seriously, refusing to participate in jokes or disrespectful comments. Another thing to consider is how we touch others, even casually or in a friendly manner — we can never know how a well-intentioned hug or pat could be taken by someone who has suffered abuse or trauma. 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GOSPEL MEDITATION

November 17, 2024
33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

I recently moved into a new neighborhood. On my first evening I went grocery shopping and could not find my usual favorite Greek yogurt. Strangely, my heart started to race. All the losses of my previous life hit me. So many of my old friends, habits, comforts, and predictable experiences had fallen away. There I stood, a grown man, crying like a little boy whose world was falling apart in the dairy aisle. This week, Jesus describes what to do when one world ends, and another begins. Does it apply to the end of time? Yes. Does it apply to the end of our individual lives? Yes. It also applies to every "world" we inhabit throughout our lives, in school, family, friendships, work, play and so on. First, the sun, moon, and stars fall. The old, familiar ways of running things suddenly stop working. Light fades. Things fall apart. It's awful. But, second, Christ comes "in the clouds." Jesus, the Son of Man, replaces those old powers with himself as the prime governing principle. Third, he sends out his angels to "gather his elect from the four winds." He re-integrates the fragments into a new integrated whole. "Summer is near," he concludes. A new world begins.

Is your world crumbling? Are your sun, moon, and stars falling from the sky? Learn to discern the pattern of the Cross and Resurrection at work in it. This is the power we touch in the Mass. Jesus is coming precisely in this transition from the old to the new world. It doesn't make our losses easy. But it does make it possible to glimpse the dawning of a summer, a new beginning, the life of the world to come.

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

17 de noviembre de 2024
33er Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Estamos ya en el penúltimo domingo del año litúrgico y las lecturas nos narran temas escatológicos, es decir de los últimos tiempos. Dicho de otra manera, lo que ocurrirá cuando llegue el fin del mundo. Aunque estos temas a veces nos asustan y preocupan, el mensaje del Evangelio está lleno de esperanza. Porque el mal no prevalecerá sobre el bien. Cristo volverá glorioso a poner todo en orden y bajo sus pies: “Y verán venir al Hijo del Hombre en medio de las nubes con gran poder y gloria” (Marcos 13:26).

Por ahora, debemos de hacer un plan de salvación, de buscar lo que nos acerque a Dios, lo que nos lleve a ser compasivos y misericordiosos, de orar más en familia, de protegernos y cuidarnos los unos a los otros. Ya basta de odios y malos tratos, de ansias de poder que acaban aparentemente con la buena semilla que hay en el mundo. Dios nos quiere libres y llenos de esperanza: “Les quiero dar paz y no desgracia y un porvenir lleno de esperanza. Cuando me invoquen y vengan a suplicarme, yo los escucharé; y cuando me busquen me encontrarán, siempre que me imploren con todo su corazón” (Jeremías 29:11-13). Hoy, también se nos pide que miremos al cielo, de donde vendrá el Hijo del Hombre el día indicado por Dios. No sabemos cuándo, pero mientras tanto, oremos sin cesar por la paz en nuestros hogares, en la sociedad y en el mundo.
