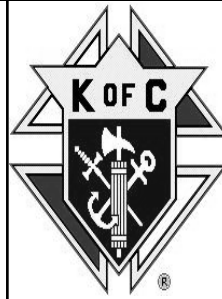

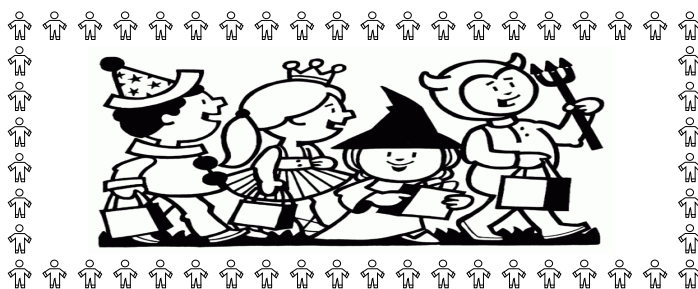

**GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE  
DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE**

**October 27, 2024  
30th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Near my house there is a school for the blind. Often, I see blind people learning how to navigate the world with only a walking stick, even on a busy street with roaring traffic. I'm amazed to see how adept and carefully they get around without sight. Nevertheless, often a sadness arises in me that he or she cannot see all the beautiful colors, images, and persons filling the world around them. Those days, I find myself deeply grateful for the basic privilege of sight.

That's part of why the mystery of Jesus as the sight-giver is so moving to me. This week, it's wonderful how Bartimaeus the blind man is no longer content with his limitation and bellows out his desire for Jesus' mercy. In beautiful simplicity, he cries out to the Lord, "Master, let me receive my sight." Jesus quietly heals his sight. And off he goes, fully taking in the world around him. Imagine the delightful new way in which he is able to respond to the world.

Like blind Bartimaeus and the courageous people in my neighborhood, we may be able to get around reasonably well in our daily lives. But we are blind to the gestures of heroic love of people close to us. We can't see the desperate need of the hungry, thirsty, imprisoned, exploited, endangered, and so on, in our midst. We can't see Jesus drawing near to us in so many ways, but he is. This Sunday let's cry out to him: Lord have mercy on me! I want to see! And little by little — or perhaps in a flash — we'll see once again, or perhaps for the first time.

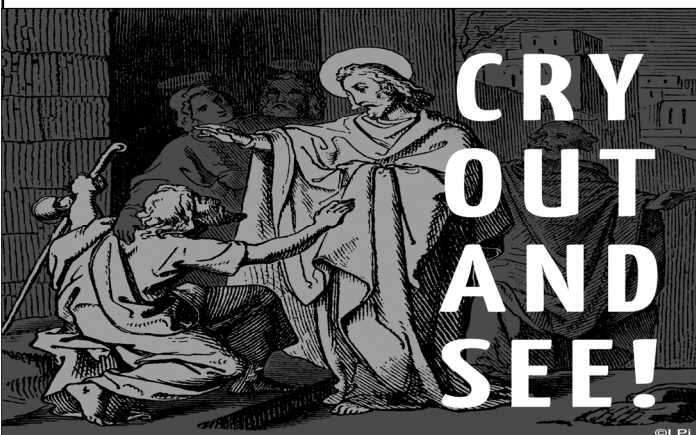

**MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO****27 de octubre de 2024****30º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario**

“Están todos, ciegos y cojos, mujeres en cinta y con hijos, y forman una multitud, que vuelve para acá. Partieron en medio de lágrimas, pero los hago regresar contentos; los voy a llevar a los arroyos por un camino plano para que nadie se caiga” (Jeremías 30:8-9). Qué bien nos conoce Dios a lo largo de los siglos, ya que se presentan las mismas situaciones en la humanidad. Ciegos, enfermos, ansiosos de poder personal, de aplastar al más débil y vulnerable. El mundo llora, el mundo sufre, familias sin patria, sin hogar, guerras sin sentido nos llevan a la destrucción total. Sin embargo, la respuesta de Dios es la misma: ¡Alégrese, yo estoy siempre con ustedes, en sus penas y alegrías!

Esto la sabía muy bien el ciego del camino de Jericó. Que animado por sí mismo, clamaba a Jesús con gritos de esperanza: “¡Hijo de David, ten compasión de mí! (Marcos 10:48). ¿Qué quieres que haga por ti?” (Marcos 10:50). Jesús también nos pregunta lo mismo a ti y a mí. Pidámosle que nos libre de la ceguera espiritual y de todas las cosas que nos atormentan. Es el perfecto momento de clamar a Él como el ciego Bartimeo. ¿Qué dices, lo harás? Hoy existe alguien que te llama para que no lo busques. Para que no asistas a la Eucaristía dominical. Para no cumplir los sacramentos y mandamientos. La fe salvó al ciego, y al instante pudo ver físicamente y siguió a Jesús por el camino, nos dice el Evangelio de hoy.

**The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is encouraging Catholics to celebrate Respect Life Month with “a revival of prayer and action,” since abortion remains the “pre-eminent priority” in the country’s political climate.**

Bishop Michael F. Burbidge, the USCCB’s Chairman of the Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued a statement exhorting Catholics to renew their commitment “to work for the legal protection of every human life, from conception to natural death” this October, which the Church has observed as Respect Life Month since 1973.

“We must call for policies that assist women and their children in need, while also continuing to help mothers in our own communities through local pregnancy help centers,” the Bishop stated, adding that Catholics must “extend the hand of compassion” to those who participated in an abortion.

“Most importantly, we must rededicate ourselves to fervent prayer on behalf of life,” Bishop Burbidge urged.

He said that while American Catholics should be grateful for the overturning of Roe v. Wade, 50 years of national access to abortion “has tragically created a national mindset where many Americans have become comfortable with some amount of abortion.” As a result, abortion remains the “pre-eminent priority” of US Catholic Bishops, given that it destroys over 1 million American lives a year.

Bishop Burbidge connected Respect Life Month to the Eucharistic Revival, saying that Jesus, who gives us the fullness of life in the Eucharist, “calls each of us to respect that gift of life in every human person.”

“While we live in a society that often rejects those who are weak, fragile, or vulnerable, they are the most in need of our care and protection,” Bishop Burbidge added.
